place. I slowly open the door to peak outside and thoroughly scan the area. Finally, I give my companion the OK to go outdoors. He immediately exits, does his own visual assessment of the situation, and is prepared to take off at a sprint in pursuit of an unsuspecting intruder. This isn't a scenario from an action movie or thrilling TV series. Rather, it's what I go through every time I let our dog out. Especially this time of year, when wildlife abounds and encounters are rather common. Our German shepherd is simply hoping he gets to chase a squirrel, rabbit, or chipmunk that has dared to enter "his" yard. I know the potential sightings are significantly more than just those three species. Allow me to share what's gone on around our place since Memorial Day, when it comes to what we've either seen or heard

My wife has always said, "The wildlife own our property, we simply live here." This year, she keeps using the term "abundant" when it comes to the sheer quantity of rabbits, squirrels, birds, Garter snakes, and American toads we keep seeing on almost a daily basis. Let's start with the rabbits. Besides seeing bunnies of all different sizes, I've seen some rather unique behaviors. Several times, we've watched two rabbits face off maybe three feet apart and then have a jumping contest. Starting in a stationary position, they just jump straight up in the air and repeatedly go back and forth to see who can get the most air. up, struck his flying captor, and was sub-It's comical to watch, but they seem to be enjoying themselves. 
During daylight, we have a hen turkey who has been visiting our back yard almost daily. Speaking of fortunate, I happened to be the first to see a rather sizeable snapping turtle laying her eggs about 25-yards from our front porch, first thing in the morning. Her back was covered in duckweed. indicating she had just come up over the bank from the old Erie Extension Canal that forms our western property line. With an 18-inch carapace (upper shell), she could have injured our dog with her strong jaws, so I distracted him and kept him away from her. So far. raccoons have not disturbed the eggs, so we may see baby snapping turtles later this Summer.

Imagine my surprise, when one morning when I first let the dog out around 6:30 AM, I saw a bald eagle feather laying on the ground, only 10-feet from our front porch! We see bald eagles flying above the Shenango River on a regular basis and three times we've observed a bald eagle sitting in a tree in our front yard. Last year, I found three bald eagle feathers about 50-yards from the house in the NW corner of our property, but this year's feather was definitely a lot closer. Speaking of raptors flying close to the house, the other day, I saw an oddity when a small 12-inch Garter snake came crashing to the ground and met its demise on the concrete apron of our pole barn. I did not see the hawk that dropped it, but the dead snake had two talon marks near its tail where its captor had grabbed it. I'm guessing the tail captured Garter snake may have reached


